### SUPPORTING UKRAINIANS IN THEIR FIGHT FOR FREEDOM

On February 24, 2022, Russia started a full-scale war against Ukraine. Being bombed from the air and shelled from the ground, Ukrainians heroically stood up to defend their freedom and democratic values from tyranny.

Millions of Ukrainians have united to protect their home — some came to the defense of the country, others began volunteering, and some continued working despite the danger and supported the economy. The Ukrainian nation has inspired the whole world with its courage and strength in its protracted fight for freedom.

Such a long-standing resilience has been possible thanks to the comprehensive support of many volunteers, charitable organizations, and donations from ordinary people worldwide. And Ukraine still needs it desperately. Because while keeping the aggressor away from the rest of the world, Ukrainian cities are severely damaged due to heavy bombings, millions of people are forced to leave their homes and flee to a safer place, and others suffer from humanitarian catastrophe.


Open Eyes Charity Fund was established in Ukraine to empower people to initiate charitable projects, raise funds for them, and volunteer as members of project teams.



### WHAT ARE WE FOCUSING ON NOW?





### HERE, THERE, AND EVERYWHERE


These are the words that best describe our volunteer network

Our branch of hubs in Ukraine and abroad, and well-established logistics, are the secret to the fund's successful work.

We deliver **humanitarian aid** wherever it is needed. Lviv, Ivano--Frankivsk, Chernivtsi, Lutsk, Rivne, Odesa, Mykolaiv, Kherson, Dnipro, Kyiv, Zaporizhzhia, Kharkiv, Khmelnytsky, Sumy, Donetsk, Luhansk and their regions, Bucha, Lysychansk, Popasna and Obukhiv have all benefited from our help so far.

Our **volunteer hubs** are in Lviv, Wroclaw, Warsaw, Austin, Holbeach and Spalding (UK).

Our **partners** are in Ukraine, Poland, UK, Ireland, USA, Germany, Bulgaria, Spain, Malta, the Netherlands, Bosnia and Herzegovina, and Canada.



As a result of the war, millions of Ukrainians are in severe humanitarian crisis situations. People remaining in dangerous areas often have no access to basic supplies, sometimes living for weeks with no water and almost no food. Others have relocated to safer zones and left everything behind. Thousands need clothing, provisions, and other necessities to meet their basic needs.


To provide humanitarian aid, *Open Eyes Charity Fund* cooperates with other trusted


charities and volunteer organizations such as Ukraine Aid EU, Come Back Alive, UA Animals, Children's Rehabilitation Centre "Dzherelo", NGO "Open Hearts", NGO "Kvity", as well as humanitarian hubs in SoftServe's own areas of operations.

We were able to help many people in dangerous areas, internally displaced people, people with disabilities, children, pets, and military hospital patients.

DRIVE FOR LIFE

While celebrating its 29th anniversary, SoftServe announced the procurement and donation of 29 fully equipped ambulances for Ukrainian defenders in conflict hotspots, in an initiative called Drive For Life. In addition to the funds allocated by SoftServe, our associates have donated **\$81,487** to this fund.

A group of volunteers quickly began work on equipping and transporting the ambulances, while doctors from the Netherlands, Germany, and Ukraine advised on the required medical devices. Service station specialists repainted and modernized the vehicles, and a group of drivers helped to transport the ambulances from abroad.

The project is ongoing. As of September 2022, the fund has bought twenty ambulances and equipment for them, particularly defibrillators, patient monitors, lung ventilators, and medicines. The project is expected to reach completion in November 2022.



# 5,800 ITEMS

Many requests from our associates defending the country relate to providing IT equipment, mainly to the defenders and our partners from different governmental and non-profit organizations. Our fund has been gathering new and used corporate equipment to cover these needs. These include laptops, PCs, monitors, modems and Starlink satellite internet kits.



We strive to help as many people as we can. To help us cover a wide range of needs, we partner with various trusted non-profit and governmental organizations.

Our partners include NGOs working with children and adults with disabilities, children with autism, animals, Lviv IT Cluster, and local administrations. The fund also supports organizations that help pets, including UA Animals, Charity Foundation Cat House, Veterinary and Sterilization Center for Homeless Animals LME "Lev," Animal shelters "Myloserdya" and "House of abandoned animals."

Open Eyes supports various humanitarian centers across Ukraine, as well as volunteering organizations, to provide humanitarian aid to people who have been affected by the war.



"With the beginning of Russia's war against Ukraine, I knew that I had to do something. So I decided to volunteer and help people from my hometown with food, provision, and medicines. Fortunately, there wasn't a choice between my work and volunteering, because the company had a corporate fund which made it much easier to combine both activities."



Volunteer Olena Dychenko, from Lviv, works in the public organization Lady Chef, which helps mothers of many children from all over Ukraine, from Kharkiv to Odesa and Mykolaiv.

"Mothers of many children all over Ukraine are quite unprotected in the face of the war. Cooperating with such a powerful corporate fund as Open Eyes helped us to be more effective in our work and support more mothers and their kids." **OPEN**EYES STORIES



Yaroslav Luchka became a volunteer in the first days of the war and actively helped his native city of Dnipro. Later, together with a friend, he started working in conflict hotspots.

"Thanks to our collaboration with the Open Eyes fund, it was possible to send aid to the Airborne Assault Brigade in Severodonetsk, 79th Air Assault Brigade in Slovyansk and 24th Mechanized Brigade in Bakhmut, all fighting in hotspots. We continue to work with the fund to collect and deliver more protection for our defenders."



A volunteering group led by Liudmyla Annych, Olesya Perepichenko, and Myroslav Nykolaev supports people with disabilities and helps them to cross the border safely. As of the beginning of August 2022, the group has helped 228 people. The fund provides them with financial aid to cover transport costs.

"At first, many private entrepreneurs helped us for free, but as fuel price rose, they were unable to continue our cooperation in such a format. I posted a call to action on Facebook, and Open Eyes responded and offered their support. We received the first tranche on the next day. Our group and the people we were able to help are extremely grateful for their support."
